Rebuttal and Surrebuttal





Relevant Vis rule

The arbitrators will decide whether rebuttal arguments will be permitted. Whether or not rebuttal will be allowed can be expected to change from one argument to the next.

Time

- Agree before the argument
- Reserve Rebuttal time in your Introduction (if it has not already been agreed upon)
- It is recommended you reserve 1 or 2 minutes



Rebuttal

- Rebuttal is not mandatory but it is a useful tool
- Respond to your opponents argument, avoid restating what you have already said
- No more than 1 or 2 points in rebuttal
- Use your time wisely



Stylistic options

- Tie in an underlying theme
- Strengthening an Argument
 - Source Citations
 - Factual Citations to the Record
- Pay attention to the arbitrators and try to resolve their remaining concerns
- Policy Argument



Surrebutal

- Make sure arbitrators are ready and paying attention before you start
- Be responsive to the rebuttal
- Use your teammate
- Use time wisely you are the last speaker



And remember...

Rebuttal and Surrebuttal are the arbitrators' last impressions of you, so finish strong!
